

From the Pastor's Desk...

"Go up on a high mountain, messenger Zion! Raise your voice and shout, messenger Jerusalem! Raise it; don't be afraid; say to the cities of Judah, 'Here is your God!' Here is the Lord God, coming with strength, with a triumphant arm, bringing his reward with him and his payment before him. Like a shepherd, God will tend the flock; he will gather lambs in his arms and lift them into his lap." Isaiah 40:9-11

To a people in exile, removed from their land and their faith, Isaiah declares that the people find the highest mountaintop to declare that God is coming in strength to care for his people again like a loving shepherd. Isaiah calls the people to find their footing in a new place, to venture out to a new vantage point, so they might declare God's goodness. To a church who has moved through another school year and most of another liturgical year (Advent until Pentecost), perhaps we do well to heed Isaiah's advice in the summer months, to find some new footing, a new vantage point, to discover something new about the grace of God at work in our lives.

Summer may be a time of slower schedules, family vacations, and trips to the pool, but in the life of our congregation summer is a time with many opportunities for focused engagement with your community of faith. For our children, our "Where Is Jesus?" Vacation Bible School kicks off the month of June. For the adults, Dr. Andrew Smith's "Calvinism and Its Discontents" (more information on both offerings is found in this newsletter) offers a chance to explore Presbyterian history in the American South, to understand where we have come from so that our eyes might be open to where God is leading us.

Following VBS, the summer church travel season to the "high mountains" of North Carolina begins as six of our high schoolers venture to the Montreat Youth Conference, to be followed later in the month by seven of our adults participating for the first time in the Montreat Worship and Music Conference. Even though gathering permission forms and pleading for final payments makes me feel like a travel agent some days, these opportunities give us new footing to declare God's faithfulness in new ways.

But that's not all! In July we will host Appalachian Outreach volunteers, with opportunities for you to give your time through preparing, serving, and cleaning up breakfast and dinner each day. Then in the middle of July ten of our youth and three chaperones return to CROSS Missions in Charlotte, North Carolina, to explore where God is at work in the midst of urban poverty, gaining a new vantage point on God's work in the world.

So many opportunities to step out of the routine of the year, to find new footing, to experience God in new ways! What excitement this is for those who travel, and what opportunities for us all to learn and serve and pray for each other! Be part of your church family this summer, find new footing, look out on God's work again and discover yourself in the flock of the shepherd, renewing and sustaining your life.
