### From the Pastor's Desk...

Be still my love Keep holding on beneath the cold December gray. We will have faith 'cause there's a savior on the way.

This refrain from Danny Mitchell's song "Savior on the Way" is our theme for this Advent season. I first learned of Danny when I accompanied our youth to the Montreat Youth Conference this summer. Danny was one of the worship leaders for music, and he's a singer/songwriter from Nashville. I purchased his Christmas album from the Montreat Store, and the more I listened to this piece, the more I wanted to use it to focus our attention in the Advent season.

In this darkest of seasons, when the sun is often hidden from our sight, when we huddle indoors, and when our neighbors become strangers in the midst of our isolation, we need a word to keep us looking forward toward our salvation. It is into this dark season that the incarnate Lord comes unnoticed, laid in a feeding trough, sung to sleep by the lullabies of adoring angels.

The great promise of Christmas, however, is that it is not simply the commemoration of a one-time event in the past, relived in pageant and carol. Christmas is the celebration of God's hallowing of creation. It is the radical notion that God's desire for us is so great that God would become enfleshed both as our quide but also as our fellow traveler. God opens up to the pain and injustice, the joy and heartbreak of human living.

And in God's act of becoming one of us in Jesus we come to see our very plain and ordinary lives as sacred. God hallows our routines. God sympathizes with our daily frustrations. God weeps in our grief. God laughs with us in our joy. God cares about skinned knees and broken hearts. God understands hurt feelings and long-held grudges. God offers forgiveness and grace not just as hypothetical platitudes but as hard-won and difficult-tooffer aifts.

In this dark season, therefore, let us look for the light- the lights on our trees and wrapped around our front porches; the lights from the Advent wreath in our sanctuary bringing forth hope, peace, joy, and love; the light of the stars who align themselves for the savior's birth; and the light of the moon that makes sure we can see the Lord's arrival.

Be still. Have faith. There's a savior on the way.
